Evidence of quantitative skills is required for admission to the MBA program. Normally this is demonstrated by a minimum score of 550 on the Graduate Management Admission Test (GMAT). The GMAT requirement may be waived with evidence of quantitative skills normally shown by successful completion of a current (within the last five years) university-level course in calculus or statistics with a grade of B (73%) or better (only considered if all other admission requirements are met or exceeded). The GMAT is recommended to strengthen an application. The GMAT is mandatory for all international applicants, as well as those applying to the MBA with Co-op format.

On the recommendation of the MBA Admissions Committee to the Dean of Graduate & Postdoctoral Studies, students may be granted exclusions, to a maximum of eight half-credit courses, for prior course credit. Exclusions may be granted for university courses taken within the last five years with a grade of 73% or higher. Exclusions for the Toronto programs are considered on the basis of a BBA, a BComm degree, or the CMA designation (the latter must be supported by detailed documentation).
