

Math entrepreneur is also a busy student

Kevin Downe, the creator of a tutoring business called Mind Over Math and a full-time student at both Wilfrid Laurier University and the University of Waterloo, is one of two winners of an Ontario student entrepreneur competition run by the group Advancing Canadian Entrepreneurship (ACE).

Downe started Mind Over Math in 2003 in Orangeville. It helps elementary and high school students who are struggling with math.

Downe is a math and business major at the two universities in Waterloo. After graduation this year, he plans to go to teacher's college.

His win qualifies him to go on to the ACE Regional Exposition in Ottawa where finalists will be chosen for a May 9 national competition in Toronto.

The national student entrepreneur of the year receives \$10,000 and represents Canada in an international event.
