(Note: The First Edition of this finding aid, which covers CMH from 1992 to summer 2004, is organized into four separate sections: **Author**, **Subject**, **Issue** and **Keyword**. In Adobe Acrobat, you can also locate articles by searching with the “search” tool (accessed by left-clicking on the binoculars icon at the top of the Adobe Acrobat screen or via the edit menu). Using this tool, you can enter a word or phrase which Adobe Acrobat will then use to search this index. If a segment of the document matches your search term it will be highlighted and displayed.
